ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That the undersigned incorporators do hereby form a non-stock, non-profit corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and pursuant to the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and under the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The corporation shall be known and named Greenbrier Residents, Inc., by which name it may contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, adopt a corporate seal, and conduct its business.

ARTICLE II

ARTICLE III

The nature and purpose of the business proposed to be tremsacted and activities to be promoted and carried on by this corporation
shall be to promote the general welfare of those params residing in
the Greenbrier Estates Subdivision, near the City of Louington, Kentucky; to adopt and promote such programs as shall enhance the beauty
of said subdivision, or as shall sours to the benefit of the residents
of said subdivision from the standpoint of their hedith, safety, and
general welfare; and, generally, to do any and all things commensurate
with the proper promotion of the health, safety, education, religious,
charitable, and recreational activities of the residents of said subdivision.

ARTICLE IV

The corporation is not organized for passuiary profit nor shall it have any power to issue any certificates of stock or declare dividends and no part of its net carnings shall ensure to the benefit of any members or directors. The balance, if any, of all money received by the corporation from its operation after the payment in full of all debts and obligations of the corporation, of whatever kind and nature, shall be used and distributed only in accordance with the nature and pusposes of the corporation as set forth herein.

ARTICLE V

The corporation shall be in perpetual existence.

ARTICLE VI

The corporation formed hereby shall have no capital stock and shall be composed of members rather than shareholders.

ARTICLE VII

The private property of the incorporators and members shall not be liable for the debts or any liabilities of the corporation, and in the event that any of the incorporators or members shall be come liable for the debts of the corporation or pay any of the debts of the corporation, then the corporation shall indemnify and hold harmices the said incorporators and members and reimbures them fully for the funds thus expended on behalf of the corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

ARTICLE IX

The number of Directors shall be at least four (4) but not more than ten (10) with ten (10) of said directors to be elected at the first annual meeting of the members of the corporation.

ARTICLE X

In the event of the liquidation of or dissolution of the corporation, all property and assets therein shall be distributed to an organization exempt under the provisions of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 which shall be selected by a vote taken of those members of this corporation eligible to vote at that time. Under no circumstances shall the assets or earnings of this corporation at the time of liquidation or dissolution be distributed to a private individual, shareholder or voting member thereof nor shall they be distributed to any organization or individual engaged or involved in activities to influence legislation.

ARTICLE XI

The limit of indebtedness of this corporation shall be unlimited.

ARTICLE XII

These Articles may be amended by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members of the corporation present at any regularly called meeting of the corporation and may be dissolved in accordance with the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.
